Not Fat — Just a Little Husky

How do you know if your dog is overweight?

Obesity in pets is an overlooked problem. Nearly 60% of dogs and cats in the US are either overweight or obese. A chubby puppy might be cute, but an overweight and obese pet can face a range of health problems; these include joint disease, respiratory disease, diabetes, cancers, and heart problems and ultimately shorter lifespans and a poor quality of life.

Sometimes the breed build and fur type can make it difficult to tell if your pet is overweight.

So here are some things to look for:

How easily can you feel your dog's ribs and shoulder bones? Can you feel your dog's spine and hip bones but not see them? Can you see your dog's last rib? Does your dog have an hourglass figure? Does your dog have a defined waist when you view them from the side?

These are some guidelines to follow:

Ribs, spine and hip bones are easily visible, little fat, very obvious waist - the pet is underweight

Ribs, spine and hip bones are not visible but can be felt easily, well proportioned, can see a waist line - the pet is the ideal weight

Ribs, spine and hip bones are not easily visible or felt, diminished waist or you can't see the waist at all, excess of fat deposits on waist, face and limbs - the pet is overweight to obese

BUT WITH THE SUPPORT OF OUR COMMUNITY, BRAWA NOT ONLY SURVIVED, BUT THRIVED. ON BEHALF OF OUR BOARD, STAFF, AND ALL OF THE ANIMALS THAT COME THROUGH OUR DOORS, I WANT TO EXTEND SINCERE THANKS TO EVERYONE WHOSE SUPPORT HAS HELPED MAKE THIS POSSIBLE.

OUR SUPPORTERS, ALONG WITH OUR DEDICATED STAFF AND VOLUNTEERS, ARE A VITAL PART OF WHAT WE DO. ALTHOUGH FINDING HOMELESS ANIMALS A NEW HOME IS OUR PRIMARY FOCUS, BRAWA WORKS IN OTHER WAYS TO ENSURE ANIMALS IN OUR CARE RECEIVE THE BEST TREATMENT POSSIBLE. BECAUSE MUCH OF WHAT WE DO IS NOT ALWAYS CLEARLY VISIBLE TO THE PUBLIC, I WANT TO SHARE SOME THINGS THAT WE ARE DOING TO ADVANCE OUR MISSION BY PROVIDING ANIMALS IN NEED WITH HUMANE TREATMENT AND GOOD HOMES WHILE ALSO WORKING TO REDUCE THE POPULATION OF UNWANTED ANIMALS THROUGH SPAY AND NEUTER PROGRAMS.

- WITH THE ONSET OF COVID, BRAWA STAFF SUCCESSFULLY ADJUSTED OUR OPERATIONS TO ADD
 PROTOCOLS AND PROCEDURES TO ASSURE OUR ANIMALS AND THOSE VISITING BRAWA HAVE A
 POSITIVE EXPERIENCE AMID THE CHANGING DEMANDS AND RESTRICTIONS. THIS INCLUDES
 PROMOTING ONLINE ADOPTIONS AND OTHER PROCESSES TO MAKE THE ADOPTION PROCESS AS
 SIMPLE AS POSSIBLE.
- NEW RELATIONSHIPS WITH SEVERAL GRANT-MAKING ENTITIES SUCH AS THE BISSELL FOUNDATION, PETCO-LOVE, THE LATHAM FOUNDATION, AND THE KENTUCKY COLONEL FOUNDATION HELP US ACHIEVE PROGRAMMING AND ACTIVITIES THAT OTHERWISE WOULD NOT BE POSSIBLE. THIS INCLUDES NEW EQUIPMENT, EDUCATION PROGRAMMING, AND NECESSARY MEDICAL SUPPLIES.
- PARTNERSHIPS WITH ANIMAL RESCUE KARE (HART COUNTY) AND OTHER ORGANIZATIONS HAVE EXPANDED OUR MISSION TO REDUCE THE NUMBER OF UNWANTED CATS AND KITTENS VIA A SPAY/NEUTER PROGRAM. WE ALSO CONTINUE TO OFFER LOW COST SPAY/NEUTER VOUCHERS TO RESIDENTS OF BARREN AND SURROUNDING COUNTIES.
- OUR RESCUE PROGRAM ALLOWS US TO TRANSPORT ADOPTABLE ANIMALS TO OTHER ORGANIZATIONS, WHICH IN TURN FREES UP SPACE IN OUR SHELTER. THIS PROGRAM IS A VITAL PART OF OUR MISSION AND WE APPRECIATE ALL WHO HELP MAKE THIS POSSIBLE.
- FINDING NEW WAYS TO PROMOTE BRAWA HAS BEEN A PRIORITY. ACTIVITIES SUCH AS EDUCATION OUTREACH IN AREA SCHOOLS, SOCIAL MEDIA, WEEKLY PROMOTIONS ON LOCAL RADIO, CLEAR THE SHELTERS AND EMPTY THE SHELTERS EVENTS, ETC. ALL HIGHLIGHT AND PROMOTE OUR MISSION OF HELPING HOMELESS ANIMALS IN OUR COMMUNITY.

IN CLOSING, WE ALWAYS LOOK FOR NEW WAYS TO HAVE A POSITIVE IMPACT IN OUR COMMUNITY AND WELCOME SUGGESTIONS OF WAYS TO DO THAT. WE ALSO SEEK VOLUNTEERS WHO WANT TO ASSIST US IN ACHIEVING OUR MISSION, SO PLEASE REACH OUT TO US TO LEARN HOW YOU CAN BECOME A PART OF BRAWA! THANK YOU, AGAIN, FOR THE SUPPORT THAT YOU PROVIDE.


